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in this beautifully designed and lavishly illustrated book toni greenbaum analyzes the output of american modernist jewelers many of whom such as alexander calder and harry bertoia began as sculptors or painters in their metal working skills many of these artists were self taught and evolved new techniques this jewelry rejected expensive precious stones in favor of cheaper irregular gems and even glass pebbles and shards of pottery the influence of surrealism cubism constructivism and abstract expressionism led these artists to explore representations of space and individual perception in ways which challenged the traditions of earlier jewelry production

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from elizabeth keckly s designs as a freewoman for abraham lincoln s wife to flamboyant clothing showcased by patrick kelly in paris black designers have made major contributions to american fashion however many of their achievements have gone unrecognized this book inspired by the award winning exhibition at the museum at fit uncovers hidden histories of black designers at a time when conversations about representation and racialized experiences in the fashion industry have reached all time highs in chapters from leading and up and coming authors and curators black designers in american fashion uses previously unexplored sources to show how black designers helped build america s global fashion reputation from enslaved 18th century dressmakers to 20th century star designers via independent modistes and seventh avenue workers the book traces the changing experiences of black designers under conditions such as slavery segregation and the civil rights movement black designers in american fashion shows that within these contexts black designers maintained multifaceted practices which continue to influence american and global style today interweaving fashion design and american cultural history this book fills critical gaps in the history of fashion and offers insights and context to students of fashion design and american and african american history and culture

what is a cabochon what are the various types of gilding what is vermeil this accessible book the first of its kind offers concise explanations of key jewelry terms the fascination with personal adornment is universal it is a preoccupation that is primal instinctive and uniquely human jewelry encompasses a seemingly endless number of ornaments produced across time and in all cultures the range of materials and techniques used in its construction is extraordinary even revolutionary with new substances and methods of fabrication added with every generation in any given society master artisans have devoted their time energy and talent to the fine art of jewelry making creating some of the most spectacular objects known to humankind this volume geared toward jewelry makers scholars scientists students and fashionistas alike begins with a lively introduction that offers a cultural history of jewelry and its production the main text provides information on the most common iconic and culturally significant forms of jewelry and also covers materials techniques and manufacturing processes containing more than eighty color illustrations this guide will be invaluable to all those wishing to increase their understanding and enjoyment of the art of jewelry

studio jewelry dissolves the modern distinction between decorative and fine arts the 60 pieces in this lively volume collected by donna schneier and donated to the metropolitan museum of art were created primarily from the early 1960s to the present day and show a fluid engagement with various traditions in jewelry making from old masterworks to contemporary pieces as well as various 20th century art movements such as conceptual art arte povera and surrealism unique by design draws attention to these dazzling small works of art most of which have never before been published although these pieces incorporate a variety of materials ranging from the precious to the ordinary they share some common traits that reflect the collector s tastes wit elegance fantasy imagination social observation and technical virtuosity above all these works were made to be worn and to create a dynamic engagement with a body publisher s website

art as adornment the life and work of arthur smith is a splendid documentary writing about a prominent player in the modernist jewelry movement the trade name artsmith came to resonate with fashion and theater types in new york and all over the country

during the three decades following world war ii as a black navigating the racial tensions of the period arthur smith managed to rise above the fray and achieve extraordinary success in the development of designs for jewelry that were eminently wearable and for the wearer a decorative pizzazz triumph with over 150 illustrations this book will take you on an awe inspiring journey starting with his parents migratory trek from jamaica through cuba and ultimately to new york city arthur s education in the arts and concluding with a detailed description of his jewelry styling and creativity

the art of carol janeway portrays the exotic life and artistic career of a woman whose commercial success as a tile decorator and ceramist in new york in the 1940s and later retirement due to lead poisoning offer a fascinating study victoria jenssen presents the career of yet another previously unrecognized woman artist carol janeway 1913 1989 who was an entrepreneur and a single mother while janeway often exhibited twice at the moma for example few museums today own janeway ceramics this book will appeal to those interested in the following artists and topics georg jensen inc and frederik lunning jens risom ossip zadkine maya deren leo lerman and richard hunter harold ambellan tusnelda sanders underglaze ceramic decoration both freehand and printed lisette model catherine yarrow ed wiener madeleine turner stalin s moscow of the early 1930s syndicated woman journalists of the 1940s ralph ingersoll and charles marsh josiah wedgwood sons lou block doris lee walter duranty eliot janeway julien levy s the imagery of chess preservation of greenwich village among several celebrity owners marilyn monroe owned five janeway doorknobs
